## C. MOISD Updates/News

Superintendent Locke reported on the following:

- MOCC enrollment: Gretchen Spedowske reported that spring enrollment looks pretty good. Administration is working diligently with our local districts.
- Graphics and Welding program enrollment are at a high. We currently have 58 students signed up for the Graphics program and 63 for the Welding program, and 17 second-year students are returning.
- Programming Changes at MOCC
- Automated Manufacturing Technology enrollment is low. We are taking a pause to reimagine the program. While in the process, we anticipate offering welding students a manufacturing focused welding course.
- IT/cybersecurity
- Early Childhood Special Education Program Re-location
- Special Education
- Extended school year programming was discussed.
- The population varies due to need. ESY(locals) and summer programming (SCI) students at the Ed Center (2 classrooms).
- Early-on (0-3yr) runs as well.
- Biennial election: June 5, 2023
- Business Manager Academy with MSBO: We are seeking an arrangement with MSBO utilizing Mark Klumpp.
  - Offer a full academy to adjacent ISDs and locals at no cost to our local districts.
