STEM Derby Challenge: Using a specialized STEM kit, students will design, build, and fine-tune their own derby car. Once the builds are complete, it's race time! Campers will put their creations to the test and compete against each other in a thrilling derby showdown. Participants must wear jeans without holes and cotton shirts and closed toed shoes. Metal Works! Welding**

Participants apply the basics of MIG welding, plasma cutting, shop safety, and working with metals to complete simple welding and fabrication projects. Safety glasses, welding helmets, and gloves will be supplied. Participants must wear long sleeve flame resistant and/or cotton shirts, jeans without holes, and leather boots daily. *Returning campers should expect to participate in the same curriculum and projects they have done in the past. ** Note: Welding has inherent risks and participants should understand they may experience burns, cuts, electrical shock, bruises, and more up to and including death.

Q: What MOCC entrance should I drop my student off at?

A: The MOCC main entrance. Their instructor will be waiting inside the building for your student.

Q: Where do I pick up my student?

A: At the same MOCC main entrance that your student was dropped off at.

Q: How can I pay?

A: You may pay in person, through the mail or over the phone. We accept cash, checks and credit cards.

Q: What are the MOCC hours to pay my student's fees?
